

GEORGE FORD (Jnr)

The grandparents of George Ford (Jnr) were Robert Ford and Sarah (nee Hutchinson) who married in 1864 in Stockton on Tees. Robert was an agricultural labourer.

They had 9 children:

Emma – Charles – Martha – William appear on the census for 1871.

The 3 eldest children do not appear on the census for 1881. William is shown along with George – Jane – Robert – Thomas – James.

On the census for 1891 George, the 5th child of Robert and Sarah, is listed as single, 18 years old and working as a Farm Servant in Scackleton for Thomas Sunley. He was born in Harome in 1872 and married Emily (nee Stephenson), born 1870, in 1897 in Stonegrave.

The son of George and Emily, George (Jnr), was born in 1895, prior to their marriage, and was baptised in Kirkbymoorside with the first names of George Ford and the surname of Stephenson.

A second son, Wilfred, was born in 1905.

From the 1901 census George and Emily, along with George (Jnr) were living at the Beast Market in Kirkbymoorside. George (Snr) was working in a manure works in the town.

The 1911 census shows that George and Emily, and their younger son Wilfred, had moved to the Crown, Hutton le Hole. George's occupation is listed as Innkeeper. It is believed that George (Jnr) was living and working in Gillamoor. On leaving the Crown George and Emily lived at Inglenook in Hutton le Hole.

George (Snr) died in Hutton le Hole in 1960 aged 88.

A death is recorded in Ryedale for a Emily Ford in 1955 aged 85.

George Ford (Jnr) married Alice (nee Ingleby) in 1919 in Lastingham and they lived for a while with George's parents at the Crown before moving elsewhere in the village. Alice was the sister of Frederick and Ernest Ingleby mentioned elsewhere in this file. His grand-daughter believes he was in Ypres in WWI and that as a result of his war service his hearing was permanently impaired. No Military Record located.

The 1901 census shows that George (Jnr's) grandfather, Robert, was living with his daughter, Martha, and her husband William Watson, an agricultural labourer, in Harome.

By the 1911 census Robert was an old age pensioner still living in Harome but now with his son Thomas who was an assistant fishmonger.

The 1911 census shows Amy Ipson, aged 10, listed as a visitor to the Crown.



Amy was the sister of William Ipson who is mentioned under 'Those Who Fell in WW1' in this file.
