

FREDERICK INGLEBY



War Medals and Cap Badge for Sherwood Foresters – Notts & Derby Regiment.

Frederick Ingleby was born on 8th July 1889, the son of John William and Elizabeth Ingleby. John came from Ramsgill, a village in Nidderdale. Frederick had an older sister Emily and younger siblings Hubert, Frances, Alice* and Ernest.

The 1901 and 1911 census shows the family living in Hutton le Hole where Alice and Ernest were born. It is believed they lived at Primrose Hill Farm before later moving to Appleton le Moors.

Frederick married Lucy Staveley at St Mary's Lastingham in 1921

They had two sons, Harry born in 1922 and Albert born in 1924.

Frederick died on 7 March 1970 in Scarborough.

He is buried in Christ Church Churchyard, Appleton le Moors

Hubert, younger brother of Frederick, is not mentioned on the Hutton le Hole War Memorial. He married his first wife Olivia Maud Burrell in 1917. She was from Hovingham and it is believed that the marriage was dissolved and she moved to Worcestershire where there is a record of her death in 1976. If this is correct it would account for Hubert's record showing a Worcestershire address. Woodston Manor is a property in Tenbury Wells. Her father was a retired army officer.

Hubert married his second wife, Fanny Staveley, in 1937. She was the sister of Frederick's wife, Lucy.

Lucy and Fanny were originally from Ebberston, but at the time of the 1911 census were living with their family at Lingmoor, Lastingham, where their father Isaac farmed. Lucy and Fanny worked in the dairy and their four brothers worked on the farm.
