

JAMES LYTHE

James, who was the son of William and Hannah Lythe (nee Best), was born in the Parish of Hutton le Hole at the end of 1880 (his age of 5 months being recorded on the 1881 census which was taken on 3rd April 1881).

He lived at Half Way House, Hutton le Hole with his father, who was a farm labourer and came from Cropton, and his mother, who was born in Fadmoor. This was still their residence as per 1891 Census.

William and Hannah married at All Saints Church, Kirkbymoorside in 1860. James had 5 brothers and a sister.

At the age of 20 years old James was working as a waggoner at Little Edstone for farmer William Cussons as shown on 1901 Census.

At the age of 26 years he married Pollie Myers on 24th December 1906 at Middleton, St Andrews Church. His occupation at that time was listed as a woodman.

Pollie came from Aislaby and following their marriage they lived at Turnpool House, Hutton le Hole. (The house, on the northern edge of the village, takes its name from the natural waterfall below it.) James' occupation is listed as gamekeeper on 1911 Census.

They had two sons – Robert William and James Frederick.
